- study of erosion and sedimentation, and their role in hydrology
- development of a sound basis for integrated sustainable management of water resources systems

*initiates, facilitates, and coordinates research into hydrological problems requiring international cooperation*

*supports hydrological sciences in developing countries*

IAHS has a long tradition of publishing and revenue is raised primarily through sales of *Hydrological Sciences Journal* and other publications. All revenues are used to support the aims of the Association, including distribution of publications free of charge to libraries in financially disadvantaged countries and subsidizing the cost of publications and conference attendance by individual members in those countries.

There are more than 5000 IAHS members in 125 countries, and 75 national committees. Members receive the IAHS Newsletter and benefit from discounts on prices of IAHS books (25% for all members, up to 80% for those in financially disadvantaged countries) and reduced rates for subscriptions to *Hydrological Sciences Journal*.
